The start of the season saw three teams entered in the Dandenong Baseball Association competition and some five games later a second "C" grade team took the field. We also fielded three junior teams in the respective under age groups.

Overall the club performed exceptionally well and whilst not successful in gaining a senior flag despite three teams in the finals our U/17's easily won their age group premiership.

"A" GRADE.

A vastly improved "A" grade had a good show of finishing second at the end of the home and away games. Unfortunately a frustrating loss to lowly Noble Park forced us back into third position. We met Bonbeach in the semi final and were hot favourites having beaten them twice during the season. However, an improvement in their batting put an end to our 1983 aspirations. 1983 was a good year. We won more games, batting averages in most cases were up and team spirit, a hard "stat" to record seemed to be better. As I said, a good year. Next season, a 100% plus effort by all players hopefully will achieve the long desired goal of a premiership pennant and make 1984 an excellent year.

"A" RESERVE.

This was a new section in the competition and a new concept being a time game. After a shakey start the competition improved when the starting time was brought forward allowing two full hours of play. This time element caused this team many early losses as on two occasions winning scores reverted when time ran out with unequal innings. On several other occasions a promising "come back" was stopped by the clock. As the season progressed and the team settled down they appeared to handle the "time" element of the game better and showed improved results. There is a lot of talent in this team, talent that sometimes was hidden by apathy or perhaps it was just plain laziness. If in 1984 a bit more aggression is shown a better result than sixth will be attained.

Our thanks go to Paul McGrath who took up the reins of coach a few games into the season and also to Jenny Holten for scoring.

"C" GRADE 1.

The C ones performed well during the home and away games with a record of ten wins, four losses and one draw and went from strength to strength as the season progressed. They finished second and played top side Cerbrus in the semi final winning that 3 - 1. This win put them into the Grand Final with high hopes of reversing the previous seasons outcome. Unfortunately this was not to be as a fine pitching performance by Cerbrus kept hits and consequently runs down to a minimum. Although naturally disappointed by the result C ones have every reason to be proud of their effort over the year as they were our most successful side. In 1984 it will hopefully be a case of third time lucky.

Once again the team was captained by Dennis Beaumont and our thanks go to him and also to their scorer Michelle Winther.

"C" GRADE 2.

This is the team that was entered five weeks into the competition and despite the late start they managed to finish in third position after the home and away games. The team was formed to give a game to the overflow from the C. Grade with the remainder of the team comprising players who wanted to have a game but who did not necessarily want to put in the time at practice etc., to the same extent as the other players. They became affectionately known as the "C Drunks". Not perhaps the most complimentary name nor even perhaps the truest but that's what they've been stuck with. Their efforts on the field however left no one in doubt that they were very sober when it came to winning matches. Unbeaten during the home and away games they surprised everyone by losing to Cerbrus in the preliminary final thus putting an end to a Frankston v Frankston Grand final.

Once again we have John Perry to thank for his hard work with the team together with two parents, Robin Goodridge and Max Lancaster, who helped out and another thank you to Michelle Winther for scoring.

When "time and game" was called at the U/17 Grand Final it gave us our first U/17 flag in 19 years and was a case of fifth time lucky for coach Peter Gloury. The Grand Final win capped off a terrific season for the team and the final score of 13-1 demonstrated that they were the best U/17 team in the competition. Congratulations to all the members of the team, to Peter and his assistant Andrew Jones and to their scorer Elaine Pearson on a magnificent year. For some of these players it sees the end of their junior career and we hope to see them back next season in our senior ranks. To those with another year in the juniors here's hoping for another great season.

Finally I would like to thank all the senior players who acted as umpires and did ground duty during the year and the parents who continually supported our juniors.
